

Pastor's Front Page Message

Dear Wildare Family,

“Time is filled with swift transitions!” These words are from a hymn that I grew up singing and oh how true it is. I may not have understood it completely when I was a child but I certainly do now. According to Macon.com, this verse is a reminder of how “life can change so quickly...” Sometimes life changes quickly for the better and sometimes it changes for the not-so-better. The refrain states and also has the title of the hymn in it as follows: “Build your hopes on things eternal. Through the eyes of a blind child at last I could see the problem was not with the world; the problem was me. And, for all those times I myself had been blind, I vowed to see the beauty in life and appreciate every second that’s mine. And then, I held that wilted flower up to my nose and breathed in the fragrance of a beautiful rose. May we all take a moment before our God, asking that we might be blessed with true sight so that we are able to see with our hearts. Then pray that God uses us this day in the lives of those disillusioned by life that they might “see” and “smell” the fragrance of His love. Small Groups

Let's get back to our small groups!! Video teachings are available!! Let Pastor Darlene know if you are interested in facilitating a small group, learning how to lead a small group or just wanting to be a part of a small group, as well as, the times that you are available (Sundays in the morning or late afternoon/evening, during the week during the day or evening or Saturdays, etc...). These can be short-term groups like 4-6 weeks or longer.



This initial document is just for your information only to get the discussion started as to where we as a church will stand on this issue. **No actions have been decided yet by Wildare UMC regarding this issue of disaffiliation.** Whereas, there are some churches that have left, many are staying to see what happens in 2024 and then make their decision. We hope to have a meeting after a combined worship service on Sun., 5/22/22. The service is scheduled to begin at 10:30 a.m. with the meeting to follow for those who can attend. We hope to share **balanced** information regarding this matter at this meeting. This is a decision not to be made lightly because there are many other implications. If you would like to watch a video by Bishop Tracy Smith Malone discussing this issue please refer back to your email forwarded from our church dated, 4/20/22. However, please remember that **NO VOTE** has been taken by our church yet.

The Word of God, the Inerrancy of the Bible and The United Methodist Church

Over the past several years, following the word of God has become a real and divisive issue between conservatives and progressives within the United Methodist Church.

Arguments that the UMC is becoming more liberal, drifting away from Biblical scriptures, and tending toward “conforming to the world”, have been at the forefront of a forthcoming split.

Issues such as sexuality and marriage and the LGBTQ, the top heavy governance structure, the usage of apportionment moneys, the Trust Clause that controls individual churches property, and the current method of appointments for Pastors are also on the table.

Five years ago the Wesleyan Covenant Association (WCA) was formed with the goal of developing the Global Methodist Church (GMC) –a more conservative Evangelical church believing in the inerrancy of the Bible.

A piece of legislation referred to as the “Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace Through Separation” was developed to go before the conference for a vote. This would have allowed for an amicable separation of property out of the UMC Trust with no or little cost. Now that the General Conference has been postponed until 2024 and the likelihood of the protocol not being passed, the GMC has announced its launch date of 5/1/2022.

For those churches who would wish to leave the UMC, and perhaps join the GMC or even become independent, a process of disaffiliation exists in the Book of Discipline (Article 2553).

This process includes a financial cost that (for most churches) is prohibitive.

Across the US , over 200 churches have currently left the UMC, including several Mega Churches.

Our East Ohio UMC Annual Conference is scheduled for June 6,7 & 8 2022 in Akron.

Our hope is that, at Annual Conference, Bishop Malone will provide a process to allow our Pastors and congregations to transfer to the newly formed Global Methodist Church (GMC).
