Dear Wildare UMC Family,

The month of November is just filled with so many special dates of gratitude. We thank God for All Saints Sunday, 11/6/22, when we will remember our members who have passed away this time last year. They are Brittany Love and Lewis Passek. We are grateful and thankful for our Veterans. We will take time during our services on 11/13/22 to dedicate a new plaque recognizing their service to our country. We will also dedicate 2 new flags in the sanctuary at the 9 a.m. service on that day as well. Other themes that we may recognize and thank God for are focusing on Stewardship, Christ the King Sunday, Thanksgiving, United Methodist Student Day and the 1st Sunday in Advent. Yes, from 11/1/22 it will only be about 55 days until Christmas!

So we ask for compassion, knowing that others may not feel the way that you do and of course vice versa. However, even in the midst of change there may be a few new members joining soon. What the future will look like for all of us, I do not know but what I do know is that God is faithful, even when we are faithless. (2nd Timothy 2:13) For those that are staying or leaving, God will be with us all and we can be grateful for that during this month of gratitude. THE WOODEN BOWL

A frail old man went to live with his son, daughter-in-law and four-year old grand-son. The old man's hands trembled, his eyesight was blurred, and his step faltered. The family ate together at the table, but the elderly grandfather's shaky hands and failing sight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor and when he grasped the glass, milk spilled on the tablecloth.



The son and daughter-in-law became irritated with the mess. "We must do something about Father," said the son. "I've had enough of his spilled milk, noisy eating and food on the floor." So the husband and wife set a small table in the corner. There, Grandfather ate alone while the rest of the family enjoyed dinner. Since Grandfather had broken a dish or two, his food was served in a wooden bowl.

When the family glanced in Grandfather's direction, sometimes he had a tear in his eye as he sat alone. Still, the only words the couple had for him were sharp admonitions when he dropped a fork or spilled food.

The four-year old watched it all in silence.

One evening before supper, the father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor. He asked the child sweetly, "What are you making?" Just as sweetly, the boy responded, "Oh, I am making a little wooden bowl for you and Mama to eat your food when I grow up."

The words so struck the parents that they were speechless. Then tears started to stream down their cheeks. Though no word was spoken, both knew what must be done. That evening the husband took Grandfather's hand and gently led him back to the family table. For the remainder of his days, he ate every meal with the family, and for some reason, neither husband nor wife seemed to care any longer when a fork was dropped, milk spilled, or the tablecloth soiled.

This story about the wooden bowl I read in the "Chicken Soup for the Soul" series really touched my heart as I hope it has yours.

As I have grown older and wiser, I've learned that each person is valuable! I've learned that, regardless of your relationship with your parents, you'll miss them when they're gone from your life.

I've learned that making a 'living' is not the same thing as making a 'life'. I've learned that life sometimes gives you a second chance. I've learned that you shouldn't go through life with a catcher's mitt on both hands; you need to be able to throw something back. I've learned that if you pursue happiness, it will elude you, but, if you focus on your family, your friends, the needs of others, your work and doing the very best you can, happiness will find you. I've learned that whenever I decide something with an open heart, I usually make the right decision. I've learned that even when I have pains, I don't have to be one. I've learned that every day, you should reach out and touch someone. People love that human touch – holding hands, a warm hug, or just a friendly pat on the back. And, I have learned that I still have a lot to learn!

As we are approaching the Thanksgiving Season, I think of the Grandfathers, Grandmothers, Aunts, Uncles, Parents, Siblings and Friends that have graced our table on Thanksgiving pasts and how we are missing them now. Sometimes we take for granted the people around the table and think they will always be there, BUT we all know that is far from the truth.

Oh, one more thing I have learned in life so far, is that this life goes so very fast and in the blink of an eye, I will be that "Grandfather" in the story!

On Saturday, October 22, 2022 a membership vote was taken at a special conference administered by our District Superintendent. It resulted in a 98 to 23 decision to allow Wildare to separate from the United Methodist Church.

We now have before us the task of finalizing the process through next June's Annual Conference, if approved there. There are several items that will need to be completed (deed transfers, amending our articles of incorporation with a name change, and the all important determination as to whether we go independent, join the Global Methodist Church, or connect with some other denomination, etc.).

To make sure that things are executed in a timely and thoughtful manner, a special committee may be established to complete these tasks.

Please be in prayer as we move forward in this new chapter in the life of "Wildare".
